Genes are the things in my body that make me who I am - short like mummy with big feet like my daddy. I was born with sickle cell disease. I got the sickle cell gene from my mummy and daddy.



My baby brother is Sam. He has sickle cell disease too.

I may need to do a blood test to see if my blood is okay.



Have you ever had vaccines? The doctor says this is to protect me from some germs.



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Do you cry when you get a blood test or vaccine? Me too.

The nurse gives me a sticker after, which makes me feel better.



Do you get pains in your bones or belly? Me too.

Mummy or daddy give me medicine. It doesn't taste good but I know it helps me feel better.



Mummy and daddy also tell me to drink lots of water and to keep warm.





I wear a rain coat when it rains so I don't get wet and a jacket when it gets cold.
