TOPIC/THEME: “Education to protect tomorrow”

Entrants are expected to depict/interpret the theme using information from MOHW Non-communicable Disease and Prevention website at ncdip.moh.gov.jm

Competition commences: Monday, November 7, 2022

Deadline: Friday, November 25, 2022 at 5:00pm

Rules:

- Posters should be 11in. x 17in.
- Orientation can be landscape or portrait
- The Ministry of Health & Wellness reserves the right to disqualify any poster that does not meet the requirements specified in these instructions
- Students will be penalized for plagiarism (passing off another person’s ideas or work as your own)
- Posters will be judged on the following criteria: interpretation of the topic, originality, neatness and presentation

How to submit:

- Fill out the entry form provided on the ncdip.moh.gov.jm website (“Prizes & Surprises” tab)
- You may either:
 - Complete and submit the electronic form
 - Download, print and complete the form
- Entrants are required to agree to the Terms and Conditions
- Please indicate your Name, School and Grade Level at the bottom of your poster

- For digital designs, use a cloud storage service such as Drop Box, SkyDrive, or Google Drive and share the link for the file via the entry form.
- Hard copy poster should be dropped off at the following address along with the completed entry form on or before the deadline:

Eligibility

- Any registered primary and secondary school student in Jamaica
- Students currently in Grades 5 to 9
- Immediate relatives of MOHW staff members are not eligible to participate in this Poster Competition

Prizes

- Prizes will be awarded to six (6) top students:
 - 1st, 2nd and 3rd place students from the primary school level (Grades 5 or 6)
 - 1st, 2nd and 3rd place students from the secondary level (Grades 7, 8 or 9)
- Each awardee will receive a trophy
- Other prizes include gift vouchers and gift baskets
